COMMITTEE REPORTS

Introduction Letter of Executive Secretary, Topaz Community Government.

The Chairman introduced Masuji Fujii, Office Executive Secretary of the Topaz Community Council, who is visiting to exchange pertinent ideas and information concerning Council operations. Saito, that a letter including a list of the kinds of fish that are suitable for the Japanese taste be sent to the Supply Officer in order that less food will be wasted. G. Nakaki was selected to write the letter.

Japanese Films

Bundles For War Prisoners

S. Kawano brought up the suggestion that comfort bags be sent to the Japanese prisoners of war who are interned in the United States. It was decided that the matter be referred to the Legal Committee for advisement.

Installation Dinner

M. Torioka made a motion that an installation dinner be held in the near future. The motion, seconded by M. Tsunokai and unanimously approved by the Council.

The Food Committee will be in charge of all arrangements.

Judicial Commission

The blocks who have not turned in the names of their representatives are to do so at the earliest possible time in accordance with the Chairman's request.
