Legal proceedings years ago, and gave it  
to Billy Irvine, who sent it together with  
other records of the Invasion to Henry Blair  
Banker of Chicago. The last time I saw  
Billy he said he would write for them.  
Billy is very enthusiastic about your  
getting the data together, and of course will  
want a copy. My partner has been  
away and I have been busy, but as  
soon as Repath is free we will get you  
something from Cannon - or least, - We want  
to get all the records, but most everything  
seems to have been destroyed. There must
