Of course your presence here would be pleasant for me, but a poor place for you; unless you were interested in seeing the various Werny, or thirty, operations daily.

I go to the hospital this Sunday afternoon and expect to be operated on tomorrow Monday morning.

I have duodenal Ulcer with Pyloric obstruction the retention in stomach once this week was 1800 c.c. acidity 70% excess HCl 30% have had stomach washed twice daily the past week, eating nothing but liquids taking 18 to 20 Blauds 5-grain pills daily, feel somewhat stronger and better than I did a week ago. I expect to pull through and feel better than I have for years. The only thing that concerns me, is the education of my children Alice and Kent, and should I not recover, I trust that you will lend your good advice to my wife, in directing the bringing up and education of the children. I would leave

about \$25,000⁰⁰ Life Insurance
which together with my other
property - of similar amount
should take care of them
at least until they are
of age.

I was not afraid that
you would publish your account
of the invasion, but that through
Billy it was apt to get
into hands, that were sure

all of it. It is true history

you wrote it, but I still think it
