I have duodenal ulcer with pyloric obstruction the retention in stomach once this week was 1800 c. c. acidity 70% excess HCL 50%. Have had stomach washed twice daily the past week. Eating nothing but liquids taking 18 to 20 Blands 5 grain pills daily. Feel somewhat stronger and better than I did a week ago. I expect to pull through and feel better than I have for years. The only thing that concerns me is the education of my children Alice and Kent and should I not recover, I wish you will lend your good advise to my wife in directing the bringing up and education of the children. I would leave about \$25000.00 life insurance which together with my other property of similar amount should take care of them at least until they are of age.

I was not afraid that you would publish your account of the invasion, but that through Billy it was apt to get into hands that were sure to publish the most if not all of it.
