RADIO & TELEVISION BROADCASTS

The Voice of America will tell listeners around the world about the Philadelphia Bulletin Forum on World Affairs.

Such forums provide excellent material for giving peoples of other lands an insight into how democracy works in the United States. The exchange of ideas by leaders in widely divergent fields of endeavor contribute immeasurably to telling overseas listeners the American Story.

The entire proceedings of the Bulletin Forum on World Affairs will be recorded. From these recordings the Special Events staff of the Voice of America will select the most valuable material and condense it into several 30-minute documentary programs for broadcast to Europe, Latin America and the Far East. Other recorded spots will be used elsewhere in the broadcast output, in addition to the news coverage of the Forum all of the 18 languages utilized by the "Voice."

The first documentary programs will be broadcast to Europe on March 30 and 31 at 12 o'clock noon EST and relayed by the transmitters we rent from BBC, as well as by our own facilities at Munich. The program will be beamed to Latin America at 8:15 P.M., EST, the same evenings and to the Far East at 5 A.M., EST, the following mornings with relays at Honolulu and Manila. The subsequent documentaries will be broadcast on a similar schedule.
