My dear Friends:

Acknowledgment is made of your letter of July 10, urging support of Senate file 2311, to protect the United States against certain un-American and subversive activities. It pleases me to have this expression from you which indicates the people of Wyoming are alert to the problems confronting the country with respect to security.

This measure has been on the Senate calendar awaiting action since last March 21st, and I want to assure you that most careful consideration will be given to your appeal when it is presented to the Senate.

You will be interested to learn that the House of Representatives just yesterday approved H.R. 7439, authorizing key Federal agencies to dismiss without appeal any employee whom the agency head considers a poor security risk. This authority would be given to the State, Defense, Treasury, Commerce and Justice Departments; the Atomic Energy Commission, the National Security Resources Board and the National Advisory Committee for Aeronautics. These agencies now employ about a million persons.
