Ly dear Hiss Hebard:

I am taking the liberty of sending to you under separate cover twenty-five letters. These are folded, scaled and stamped. The letter and accompanying questionnaire I enclose herewith.

I am anxious to get the opinion of the women as to the causes which controlled the woman's vote. I am sure the women of Tyoming believe in the Federal Amendment. Cur eastern papers who are hard to deal with and often hostile are saying now that the vote shows that the women of the west do not care about the Federal Amendment because they voted for Wilson. I do not believe that for one moment, but I want proof of it.

We will tabulate the returns from the different states and thus have something to back our demand when Congress opens. Any information you can give us as to the causes which controlled the voyan's vote will be useful and valuable.

Is it possible to learn the number of men and woman approximately who voted on Hovember 7th? I am sure that in Myoming the voted in the same boxes. Perhaps the Mection Board can give us some information.

I am sending one questionnaire for you blene which concerns the method of organization of the women in Myoming, and I will ask you to answer both questionnaires. In the event you need to take time to answer some of the questions will you kindly send me your opinion as to the attitude of the voten of Myoming toward the Federal Imendment.

I will ask you to mail these letters to the women of all political faiths for it is a general opinion we want and not those of any particular party. I should be glad to have about one-half of them go to bemocratic women and one-half Republican women.
